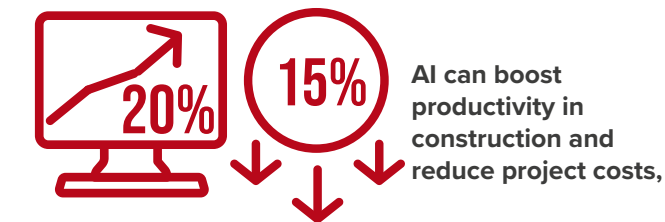

LEGISLATIVE CHANGES IN UK PRIVATE SECURITY, CONSTRUCTION, AND AVIATION MARKETS: WHAT TO EXPECT IN 2024 AND BEYOND.
